

Stockholm International Youth Science Seminar – 2026 MDHS application information

[Stockholm International Youth Science Seminar \(SIYSS\)](#) is a program hosted by the Swedish Federation of Young Scientists, which welcomes 25 of the world's young scientists to Stockholm during Nobel Week each year. SIYSS is likely to be held from **4th–11th December 2026**.

MDHS is invited to send **one participant aged between 18 and 25**, who will share their research, visit scientific and research organisations, and attend Nobel Prize events.

To be eligible, you must:

- Be between 18 and 25 years old during the SIYSS week 2026. This means you cannot be younger than 18 years old at 4 December 2026, nor older than 25 years old at 11 December 2026. Those who will turn 26 on or before 11th of December are ineligible
- Be enrolled as an MDHS student at the time of the seminar week
- Be fluent in English and able to present your project in an understandable way to an audience of non-native English speakers.
- Have completed a piece of research as part of a Bachelor, Masters, PhD or equivalent.
- Have completed your research project independently. The submitted research project should not have been performed in cooperation with other students.
- Have not engaged in any academic or scientific misconduct in the undertaking of their research project and followed accepted international ethical principles for research.

Conditions

If selected by the University, participants are required to send SIYSS certain materials, including a short video presentation about their research and a project poster, abstract and report, ahead of the SIYSS week. Participants will also be required to provide a report to the University of Melbourne reflecting on the experience.

How to apply

Create a single PDF document of no more than 6 pages in total containing:

- Personal cover letter
- CV
- Research abstract (250 words)
- Letter of recommendation from your research supervisor confirming your significant and independent contribution to the research project

AND

- A 3-Minute Video Pitch summarising:
 - Your research project and significance of your research
 - Why you want to take part in SIYSS
 - Why MDHS should nominate you.
