Selection criteria



Doctor of Medicine (MD)

Entry requirements

1. To be considered for entry, applicants must have completed:

Either -

- An undergraduate degree in any discipline, with studies to have been completed within 10 years of 1 January in the year in which the applicant intends to commence the MD; OR
- For applicants whose most recently completed undergraduate degree
 was completed 10 or more years before 1 January of the year in which
 the applicant intends to commence the MD a Graduate Diploma,
 Masters or PhD degree (or equivalent) completed within 10 years
 before 1 January of the year in which the applicant intends to
 commence the MD;
- 2. Competed either -
 - The Graduate Australian Medical Schools Admission Test (GAMSAT)⁹; OR
 - For international students who are residing outside of Australia at the time of application, either the GAMSAT or the North American Medical Colleges Admission Test (MCAT);
- **3.** Perform satisfactorily in the Multi Mini Interview (MMI) restricted to shortlisted applicants.
- **4.** Applicants are required to satisfy the <u>University's English language</u> requirements for postgraduate courses. For applicants seeking to meet these requirements by one of the standard tests approved by the Academic Board, performance band 7 is required.

Note: In ranking applications, the Selection Committee will consider:

- Prior academic performance; and
- The GAMSAT or MCAT score; and
- The Multi Mini Interview (MMI).

The Selection Committee may seek further information to clarify any aspect of an application in accordance with the <u>Academic Board's rules</u> on the use of selection instruments.

GAMSAT

- All international applicants residing in Australia at the time of application must sit the GAMSAT.
- A minimum score of 50 in each of the three sections of the GAMSAT is required to be considered for selection into the MD. This is a minimum score only as selection into the MD is highly competitive.
- An average of the three sections of the GAMSAT will be used for selection into the MD.
- The differentiation between GAMSAT Australia, UK and Ireland have been removed.
- GAMSAT results are valid for up to four consecutive years after test date. Applicants can <u>check the</u> <u>validity of the GAMSAT results on the GAMSAT website</u>.

MCAT

- MCAT results can only be used by international applicants who are not residing in Australia at the time of application.
- A minimum score of 492 is required to be considered for selection into the MD. This is a minimum score only as selection into the MD is highly competitive.
- MCAT results are valid for up to four consecutive years after test date.
- For 2025 commencement, MCAT scores from test sitting dates from 1 January 2021 will be accepted and test results must be available by 25 July 2024.
- Official MCAT score reports must be submitted with both the verification code and AAMC ID number visible. Unofficial reports or screenshots of MCAT score reports will not be accepted.

Grade Point Average

The performance of MD applicants in their previous studies will be assessed using a Grade Point Average (GPA; 7-point scale) computed in the following way as approved by the Academic Board:

- The most recent bachelors degree results (including Honours when available¹¹) will be used for the purposes of calculating the GPA regardless of any subsequent graduate studies completed.
- The GPA will be measured by considering the last three years of the applicant's most recent undergraduate coursework studies (including Honours when available¹¹).
- Weightings will be applied by weighting the first of the final three years by 1, the second of the final three years by 2, and the final year by 2.

A minimum GPA of 5 is required to be considered for selection into the MD. This is a minimum score only as selection into the MD is highly competitive.

Multi Mini Interview (MMI)

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an online recorded Multi Mini Interview (MMI) for the Doctor of Medicine (MD). This will not be a real-time, face-to-face interview. Question prompts will be presented to applicants on an online platform rather than by an interviewer.

Please refer to the 'Doctor of Medicine Application of Interview in Course Selection Guidelines' document on the <u>Doctor of Medicine Entry requirements webpage</u> (under the 'Further information' heading) for details on how the results from the MMI are applied to the MD applications.

Treatment of Honours in selection for the MD

GPA will be measured by considering the last three years of the applicant's undergraduate coursework studies, only including Honours where the Honours degree is completed by June 2024, and the results are available by 15 July 2024.

If an Honours degree is not completed by mid year in the year of application, then weightings will be applied by weighting the first of the final three pre-honours undergraduate years by 1, the second of the final three years by 2, and the final year by 2.

Please note, Honours results are **not included** in WAM calculations for the Guaranteed Entry Pathway:

- Melbourne Chancellor's Scholarship; or
- Guaranteed Full Fee Entry Pathway



Selection notes

1 MD Standard Pathway - International

All MD Standard Pathway applicants are ranked for selection.

Equal weighting is applied to the GPA and GAMSAT/MCAT score in determining the ranked list for interview selection.

1. Interview selection

After the interview process has concluded, interviewed applicants are re-ranked based on their combined GAMSAT/MCAT, GPA and MMI results where GAMSAT/MCAT contributes 25%, GPA contributes 25%, and MMI contributes 50% to the final ranking for a course offer.

Please note the following:

- Selection into the Doctor of Medicine is highly competitive. Achieving minimum entry requirements and scores does not guarantee selection.
- The Selection Committee may re-rank applicants with a high level of performance in postgraduate studies in a cognate area subject to the following:
 - Postgraduate study must have been completed within 10 years of commencement of the Doctor of Medicine; and
 - Postgraduate study must be equivalent of at least a 1-year full time program; and
 - Postgraduate study must be in a discipline that builds upon studies completed at the undergraduate level; and
 - Postgraduate study must be in a health related or biological sciences discipline.

Up to 10 places in the Doctor of Medicine are available for selection applicants re-ranked on the basis of postgraduate study. The Selection Committee is not required to fill this quota and any unused places will be allocated as normal.

2 MD Guaranteed Entry Pathway

This pathway reserves a place in the MD for eligible students after they complete their undergraduate degree at the University of Melbourne, subject to some additional terms and conditions.

There are two ways to qualify for the MD Guaranteed Entry Pathway:

1. Melbourne Chancellor's Scholars

Melbourne Chancellor's Scholars are eligible for the MD Guaranteed Entry Pathway if they:

- Are current University of Melbourne students in the final year of their undergraduate degree applying for the following year's intake or if they graduated from their University of Melbourne bachelors degree no more than 18 months prior to the intake they are applying for¹²; and
- Completed an Australian Year 12 or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma in Australia with an ATAR of 99.90 or above (or equivalent); and
- Enrolled in a University of Melbourne undergraduate degree immediately following Year 12 (or were granted a deferral by the University).

The guaranteed place is subject to certain terms and conditions. Melbourne Chancellor's Scholars will need to:

• Pass the Multi Mini Interview (MMI) as part of the MD application process.

Please note:

- Melbourne Chancellor's Scholars do not need to sit the Graduate Australian Medical School Admission Test (GAMSAT) as part of their MD application.
- Additionally, no minimum Weighted Average Mark (WAM) is required in a Melbourne Chancellor's Scholar's undergraduate degree to reserve their place in the MD.
- Eligible international Melbourne Chancellor's Scholars will receive a guaranteed International full fee place in the MD.

2. Guaranteed Full Fee Entry

Guaranteed Full Fee Entry students are eligible for the MD Guaranteed Entry Pathway if they:

- Are current University of Melbourne students in the final year of their undergraduate degree applying for the following year's intake or if they graduated from their University of Melbourne bachelors degree no more than 18 months prior to the intake they are applying for¹³; and
- Completed an Australian Year 12 or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma in Australia with an ATAR of 99.00-99.85 (or equivalent); and
- Enrolled in a University of Melbourne undergraduate degree immediately following Year 12 (or were granted a deferral by the University).

The guaranteed place is subject to certain terms and conditions. Guaranteed Full Fee Entry students will need to:

- Pass the Multi Mini Interview (MMI) as part of the MD application process; and
- Maintain a Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of at least 75%¹⁴.

Please note:

- Guaranteed Full Fee Entry students do not need to sit the Graduate Australian Medical School Admission Test (GAMSAT) as part of their MD application.
- Eligible international Guaranteed Full Fee Entry students will receive a guaranteed International full fee place in the MD.

Treatment of results from 2020

The following relates to all pathways for the Doctor of Medicine (MD), including pathways which use GPA as well as pathways which use WAM for entry:

- Results for 2020 subjects completed before the COVID-19 pandemic (i.e. January 2020 to March 2020) and results for Honours subjects completed in 2020 will be included in entry score calculations for the Doctor of Medicine.
- All other 2020 subject results completed from April 2020 to December 2020 will be excluded from entry score calculations for the Doctor of Medicine.
- This is applicable from 2022 for all forthcoming intakes.

Note: Honours results will not be included in WAM calculations for <u>Guaranteed Full</u>
<u>Fee Entry</u> students as part of the Guaranteed Entry Pathway. Guaranteed Full Fee
Entry applicants are required to maintain a WAM of at least 75% in their
undergraduate degree at the University of Melbourne to access the Guaranteed Entry
Pathway to postgraduate study.

Clinical school zones

The <u>University of Melbourne's clinical schools</u> are located in affiliated teaching hospitals, where Doctor of Medicine (MD) students will spend the bulk of the clinical years of the course. These schools are grouped into two clinical school zones: the **Metro zone** (Inner East and North West) and the **Rural zones**.

Please note, due to funding arrangements for the Rural Clinical School, **successful international applicants will only be allocated to the Metro zone**. Specific clinical schools within the Metro zone are based in the Inner East and North West. Applicants are advised to read through the <u>Clinical School Zone</u> <u>allocation and Clinical School allocation policy and procedure</u> for more information.

MD redesign

The 21st century requires medical graduates who can thrive in complex environments and be the leaders of change. That's why we launched the redesigned Doctor of Medicine (MD) program in 2022. Learn more about the MD redesign here.

It should be emphasised that a science major is **not** a prerequisite for the MD. Academic excellence in other areas, such as the humanities and social sciences, is encouraged and recognised. The University of Melbourne encourages applications from individuals with diverse educational backgrounds, who will bring a variety of talents and interests to the profession.







- The next most recently completed and eligible 100 credit points are weighted by 1.


Note:

- Studies completed concurrently will be selected for inclusion in the most recent 100 credit points according to performance, starting from the subject with the highest mark.
- Results for failed subjects will also be included in the WAM calculation for the year in which they were studied and will be included in the most recent 100 credit points.

A minimum WAM of 65 is required to be considered for selection into the OD. This is a minimum score only as selection into the OD is highly competitive.

Admissions test

Which admissions tests are OD applicants eligible to take?³²

GAMSAT

- All international applicants residing in Australia at the time of application must sit the GAMSAT.
- No minimum GAMSAT score is required for the OD, however selection into this course is highly competitive.
- All sections in the GAMSAT will be weighted equally to determine the GAMSAT score used for selection in the OD.
- The differentiation between GAMSAT Australia, UK and Ireland have been removed.
- GAMSAT results are valid for up to four consecutive years after test date. Applicants can <u>check the validity of the GAMSAT results on the GAMSAT website</u>.

MCAT/OAT

- MCAT/OAT results can only be used by international applicants who are not residing in Australia at the time of application.
- No minimum MCAT/OAT has been set for the Doctor of Optometry, however selection into the course is highly competitive.
- MCAT results are valid for up to four consecutive years after test date. For 2025 commencement, MCAT scores from test sitting dates from 1 January 2021 will be accepted and test results must be available by 31 July 2024.
- Official MCAT score reports must be submitted with both the verification code and AAMC ID number visible. Unofficial reports or screenshots of score reports will not be accepted.

2 OD Guaranteed Entry Pathway

This pathway reserves a place in the OD for eligible students after they complete their undergraduate degree at the University of Melbourne, subject to some additional terms and conditions.

There are two ways to qualify for the OD Guaranteed Entry Pathway:

1. Melbourne Chancellor's Scholars

Melbourne Chancellor's Scholars are eligible for the OD Guaranteed Entry Pathway if they are:

- Are current University of Melbourne students in the final year of their undergraduate degree applying for the following year's intake or if they graduated from their University of Melbourne bachelors degree no more than 18 months prior to the intake they are applying for³³; and
- Completed an Australian Year 12 or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma in Australia with an ATAR of 99.90 or above (or equivalent); and
- Enrolled in a University of Melbourne undergraduate degree immediately following Year 12 (or were granted a deferral by the University).

³³ Entry is only guaranteed if the OD is commenced within 18 months of completing their bachelors degree and no further study is undertaken (except Honours at the University of Melbourne).



The guaranteed place is subject to certain terms and conditions. Melbourne Chancellor's Scholars will need to:

 Pass on the first attempt, <u>approved prerequisite subjects</u> in one or more relevant Biological Science disciplines at a second or third year level (three subjects in total; or equivalent) at the University of Melbourne.

Please note:

- No minimum Weighted Average Mark (WAM) is required in a Melbourne Chancellor's Scholar's undergraduate degree to reserve their place in the OD.
- Eligible international Melbourne Chancellor's Scholars will receive a guaranteed International full fee place in the OD.

2. Guaranteed Full Fee Entry

Guaranteed Full Fee Entry students are eligible for the OD Guaranteed Entry Pathway if they are:

- Are current University of Melbourne students in the final year of their undergraduate degree applying for the following year's intake or if they graduated from their University of Melbourne bachelors degree no more than 18 months prior to the intake they are applying for³⁴: and
- Completed an Australian Year 12 or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma in Australia with an ATAR of 99.00-99.85 (or equivalent); and
- Enrolled in a University of Melbourne undergraduate degree immediately following Year 12 (or were granted a deferral by the University).

The guaranteed place is subject to certain terms and conditions. Guaranteed Full Fee Entry students will need to:

- Pass on the first attempt, <u>approved prerequisite subjects</u> in one or more relevant Biological Science disciplines at a second or third year level (three subjects in total; or equivalent) at the University of Melbourne; and
- Maintain a Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of at least 75%³⁵.

Please note:

- Guaranteed Full Fee Entry students do not need to sit the Graduate Australian Medical School Admission Test (GAMSAT) as part of their OD application.
- Eligible international Guaranteed Full Fee Entry students will receive a guaranteed International full fee place in the OD.

3 OD Graduate Degree Package

Eligible high school leavers can apply for one of the <u>Graduate Degree Packages</u> offered by the University of Melbourne for the <u>Doctor of Optometry (OD)</u> via the <u>Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC)</u>.

Students eligible for a Graduate Degree Package for the OD have:

- Completed an Australian Year 12 or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma in Australia with an ATAR of at least 99.00 (or equivalent); and
- Achieved a Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of at least 75%³⁶ in their University of Melbourne undergraduate degree; and
- Pass on the first attempt <u>approved prerequisite subjects</u> in one or more relevant Biological Science disciplines at a second or third year level (three subjects in total; or equivalent) at the University of Melbourne.

There are two Graduate Degree Packages available for the OD:

- (i) Bachelor of Biomedicine + Doctor of Optometry
- (ii) Bachelor of Science + Doctor of Optometry

Please note:

 Graduate Degree Package students must commence the OD within 18 months of completing their bachelors degree, noting that no further postgraduate study can be undertaken in this time (except for Honours at the University of Melbourne)

Treatment of results from 2020

The following relates to all pathways for the Doctor of Optometry (OD), including pathways which use WAM for entry:

- Results for 2020 subjects completed before the COVID-19
 pandemic (i.e. January 2020 to March 2020) and results for
 Honours subjects completed in 2020 will be included in entry
 score calculations for the Doctor of Optometry (OD).
- All other 2020 subject results completed from April 2020 to December 2020 will be excluded from entry score calculations for the Doctor of Optometry (OD).
- This is applicable from 2022 for all forthcoming intakes.

Note: Honours results will not be included in WAM calculations for <u>Guaranteed Full Fee Entry</u> students nor <u>Graduate Degree Package</u> students. Guaranteed Full Fee Entry students are required to maintain a WAM of at least 75% in their undergraduate degree at the University of Melbourne to access the Guaranteed Entry Pathway to postgraduate study. Graduate Degree Package students are required to maintain a WAM of at least 75% in their undergraduate degree at the University of Melbourne to access their Graduate Degree Package for the OD.

Qualifying undergraduate degrees

All applicants must have completed or be in the final year of and undergraduate degree at the time of application.

1. What is considered an undergraduate degree?

An undergraduate degree is defined as a degree of at least three years in duration when studied full time (or equivalent), from a recognised university.

Please note the following:

- The undergraduate degree must be an AQF³⁷ Level 7 qualification (at minimum) and must be comprised of at least three full-time equivalent years (3.0 FTE³⁸) worth of study.
- Undergraduate degrees completed in Australia must be from a Commonwealth-accredited institution.
- Undergraduate degrees completed overseas must be from a recognised institution and must be
 equivalent to an Australian Bachelor degree, as determined by the <u>Australian Government's</u>
 <u>Department of Education</u>.
- If the undergraduate degree was completed more than 10 years ago (before 1 January of the year in which the applicant intends to commence the MD, DDS, DPT or OD), a Graduate Diploma, Masters or PhD degree (or equivalent) must have been completed within the last 10 years.
- Two-year accelerated undergraduate degrees, where three full-time equivalent years (3.0 FTE³⁸) worth of study is fast-tracked over two years, may be accepted if completed by 31 December in the year of application at the discretion of the relevant selection committee. Undergraduate degrees containing only 2.0 FTE³⁸ worth of study will not be accepted.
- A conversion degree is defined as an undergraduate degree that includes credit from previous studies undertaken below AQF³⁷ Level 7 (e.g. a Bachelor degree containing prior credit from a TAFE³⁹ certificate/diploma). A conversion degree may be accepted depending on the level and extent of credited study, at the discretion of the relevant selection committee.
- An undergraduate/undergraduate combined degree or undergraduate/postgraduate combined degree must be completed by 31 December in the year of application. An early exit from a combined degree will be accepted if the applicant has been approved by the conferring institution to exit the qualification early with a three-year FTE³⁸ degree and has declared the early exit or alternative award in their application.

Prerequisites

2. How do I check if the subjects I have studied satisfy the prerequisite requirement?

The <u>Prerequisites website</u> includes more information about prerequisites, including lists of subjects which have already been assessed to determine equivalency (approved and non-approved subjects). Applicants should check the available lists to determine whether they are eligible for consideration.

What if a subject I have studied is not on the pre-assessed prerequisites list for the Doctor of Dental Surgery/Doctor of Physiotherapy/Doctor of Optometry?

We strongly encourage you to <u>submit your subjects for assessment</u> well in advance of course applications opening if they have not already been assessed as meeting the prerequisite subject requirement for the course you are applying for.

The deadline for submitting prerequisite subjects for assessment is four weeks prior to the application closing date. Please refer to the specific deadlines by course on pages 6, 7 and 8 of this guide.

Applicants will be deemed to have failed to meet the prerequisite requirement and will not be considered for selection if:

- Applications are received where prerequisite subjects have been submitted for assessment after the deadline; or
- Where evidence of completing/being enrolled in relevant prerequisite subjects has not been provided.
- 4. What if I have not completed approved prerequisite subjects at the time of application?

If you have not satisfied the prerequisite requirements at the time of application, you may still submit a course application. In your course application, you must provide evidence of enrolment in approved prerequisite subjects in the second half of the year. Prerequisite conditions must be satisfied by the relevant deadlines.

5. I have completed the prerequisite subjects more than 10 years ago. Do I need to redo these subjects?

If the qualifying prerequisite subjects are more than 10 years old, you will need to complete them again.

6. Does the University of Melbourne offer any subjects to satisfy the prerequisite requirements?

Yes. The following subjects satisfy the prerequisite requirements for the Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS), Doctor of Physiotherapy (DPT) and Doctor of Optometry (OD):

- Anatomy: ANAT20006 Principles of Human Structure
- Physiology: PHYS20008 Human Physiology
- Biochemistry: BCMB20002 Biochemistry and Molecular Biology

Transcript requirements

Applicants are required to submit the following documentation by the course application closing deadline:

- Official academic transcripts
- Official admissions test results e.g. GAMSAT
- Grading scales

Official transcripts are required to show degree conferral information if they have been completed.

Applicants are required to include official transcripts and grading scales from:

- Exchange studies;
- Cross-institutional studies; or
- Any other tertiary studies that have been credited towards the key degree (i.e. the degree used for entry score calculation).

7. What if I will only be completing my undergraduate degree in 2024?

If you will be completing an undergraduate degree in 2024, please submit official transcripts and grading scales for all your studies so far. You must also provide evidence of enrolment for Semester 2, 2024 by the course application closing deadline.

Entry scores

Admissions for the Doctor of Medicine (MD), Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS), Doctor of Physiotherapy (DPT) and Doctor of Optometry (OD) use two types of entry score formats:

Grade Point Average (GPA)

GPA indicates an applicant's overall academic performance in their qualifying undergraduate degree.

GPA is used to assess applications for further study in the Doctor of Medicine: Standard Pathway⁴⁰, Doctor of Dental Surgery: Standard Pathway, and Doctor of Physiotherapy: Standard Pathway.

GPA calculation

Applicants may wish to calculate their rough GPA using the <u>GPA Calculator on the GEMSAS website</u>. Please note, this calculator has been designed based on the framework and rules around the calculation of a base GPA across GEMPASS Australia schools. Each institution, including the University of Melbourne, has different GPA methodology and requirements including how they consider and use your study. As such, any GPA calculated by an applicant using this tool will be **an estimated GPA only**.

Weighted Average Mark (WAM)

The University of Melbourne uses Weighted Average Mark (WAM) to provide an indication of an applicant's overall academic performance in their qualifying undergraduate degree.

Your overall University of Melbourne WAM is used as the basis for entry into all of our Guaranteed Entry Pathways. If your overall WAM includes results from 2020 and 2021, please refer to how these are treated in the relevant Handbook entry:

- Doctor of Medicine Handbook
- Doctor of Dental Surgery Handbook
- Doctor of Physiotherapy Handbook
- <u>Doctor of Optometry Handbook</u>

WAM calculation for Guaranteed Entry Pathways

WAM reflects the numeric mark (e.g. 45%, 87%) and the number of credit points (e.g. 12.5 credit points, 25 credit points) for each subject completed as part of a course.

WAM is calculated using this formula:

Sum of (Total credit points for subjects)

For example, a student has completed three subjects. Two are worth 12.5 credit points and the third is worth 37.5 credit points. They attained 76%, 67% and 81% respectively. The resulting calculation would be:

$$\frac{(76 \times 12.5) + (67 \times 12.5) + (81 \times 37.5)}{=} = \frac{4825}{=} = WAM 77.200\%$$

$$12.5 + 12.5 + 37.5$$

WAM calculation for the Doctor of Optometry (OD) Standard Pathway – International

The Doctor of Optometry (OD) considers a weighted WAM using your most recently completed and eligible 200 credit points of undergraduate studies (including Honours when available). Weightings will be applied by weighting the most recently completed and eligible 100 credit points (equivalent to one year full time study) by 2 and weighting the next most recently completed and eligible 100 credit points by 1.



Multi Mini Interview (MMI)

8. What is the MMI?

At the University of Melbourne, an interview forms part of the application process for the Doctor of Medicine (MD) and the Doctor of Physiotherapy (DPT). This interview is called the 'Multi Mini Interview' or 'MMI'.

The MMI consists of:

- 8 separate interview stations;
- Each station takes 5 minutes to complete; and
- Each station comprises of several questions on the same topic.

The duration of the whole interview process is **approximately 50 minutes**, but applicants are required to be in attendance for a few hours on their allocated MMI day.

The MMI is designed to assess non-cognitive qualities, including:

- Professionalism;
- Motivation;
- Communication skills;
- Ability to empathise and provide support;
- Attitude towards collaboration; and
- Aptitude for decision making.

9. How is the MMI assessed?

The selection committee is looking for authentic and genuine responses to the interview questions rather than highly rehearsed responses.

For the Doctor of Medicine (MD), achieving a minimum overall score of at least 50% of the total possible MMI score, as well as being above the cut-score in 5 out of 8 stations is considered satisfactory.

For the Doctor of Physiotherapy (DPT), achieving an overall score of 80% of the total possible MMI score is considered satisfactory.

10. Can I test the MMI platform beforehand?

Applicants shortlisted for a Doctor of Medicine (MD) MMI will have time to test the online platform prior to their actual recorded interview. The practice MMI is a chance for applicants to ensure their systems are compatible for the genuine MMI. The sample questions will not be repeated in the genuine MMI.

Applicants shortlisted for the Doctor of Physiotherapy (DPT) MMI will be provided further information about the interview platform when they receive the invitation in August.



Conditional offers

Selected applicants will receive a conditional offer if:

- An offer is made where the degree and/or prerequisite subject(s) is not yet complete; or
- The applicant has not met the English language requirements yet.

Please note, if conditions are not met by the date specified on the offer letter, the offer will be withdrawn.

My grades slipped in the final semester of my qualifying undergraduate degree. Can I still get my offer, even if my final entry score falls below the required entry score listed on my conditional offer?

Applicants who are made an offer conditional on maintaining a specified minimum GPA will have their full offer confirmed if they have maintained or exceeded this GPA in their final semester. An applicant whose final GPA drops, but only by 0.3 or less will, in most cases, have their offer confirmed. Applications with a GPA drop of more than 0.3 will be considered by the Selection Committee. If the initial ranking and extent of drop does not put the applicant below the selection pool for that fee type, their offer will most likely be confirmed. This is subject to quotas and considered on a case-by-case basis. Confirmation of the place will only be possible in cases where the applicant's initial GPA was high enough that a drop in GPA will not have a significant impact on the application rankings.

Applicants who are made an offer conditional on maintaining a specified minimum WAM will have their offer confirmed if they have maintained or exceeded this WAM in their final semester. Applicants whose final WAM drops below the specified minimum WAM on their offer letter will be deemed to have not met the conditions of their offer and will be considered by the Selection Committee on a case-by-case basis.

My conditional offer is asking for evidence that I have completed my combined degree, but I am planning an early exit for my bachelor/bachelor double degree. Can I still satisfy the conditions of my offer?

Applicants enrolled in a combined degree who receive a conditional offer for a place at the University of Melbourne based on that combined degree, **must complete both awards to have their offer confirmed** (i.e. **become an unconditional offer**). If you have confirmed your early exit in time (early in the application process), your conditional offer would not be based on the completion of both awards.

- 13. If I am granted Australian permanent residency, can my International full fee place be switched to an Australian full fee place or a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP)?

If an international student is granted Australian Permanent Residency, Australian Citizenship or New Zealand Citizenship while enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine (MD), Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS), Doctor of Physiotherapy (DPT) or Doctor of Optometry (OD), they will need to notify the University.

If you are in this situation, your fee type will change to an Australian full fee place. Please note, it is not possible to change from a full fee place to a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) after you have commenced your course.
